Our Service Projects

BOOKS, BOOKS, BOOKS

Our book elves have been busy stickering, bagging and shelving! We have tackled 51 cartons of books and made a huge dent!!

We decided to bag up books for individual schools as we went (vs. shelving them and THEN pulling them). We had a "spreadsheet" with all of our schools on it....and all of the school's classroom numbers on it and then we went to town!!!

On Jan 11th and 12th, Susan and Anita sorted and stickered over 700 books at the warehouse. They bagged up books for 5 South Portland schools and 3 Westbrook schools. We also began to bag up middle school books. We are anticipating a "Drop Off Book Blizzard" this year. We've put 25 unique books into a bag...and labeled it "MIDDLE SCHOOL".

On Jan 15th, Wanda flexed her muscles as she picked up books for Windham Primary. That is a big school! WPS has 11 kindergarten classrooms! Wanda is in touch with Lindsey who requested 15 books for each K class!

Ann S., Martha G. and Susan tackled the beginning of the Portland School requests on Jan. 15th. They sorted and stickered...and bagged and shelved 400 books. The massive tower of boxes is shrinking!

Martha G returned to the warehouse on Tuesday, Jan. 19th to work on some Portland schools and ALL of the books for Lake Region!! Very efficient, Martha stickered and shelved and bagged 170 books. She also coordinated with Trish to get the books up to Naples. Trish's personal courier, "our" baby Brianna, picked up 8 bags of books and delivered them to "Grandmother"!!

At the warehouse on the 21st, one can only imagine the hilarity as Wanda, Fran J., Christine and Karen V got together!! They finished the available bags for Ptld. Schools and shelved a lot!! Coffee afterwards must have been fun!!

Stickering and shelving continues Jan. 25th and 29th as Susan, Fran J., Nicki, Wanda, Christine and Pam L. gather! Stay tuned for an update of where we stand with shelving!!!




