

January 2024 Nominating committee meets in preparation of canvasing candidates for the slate. Reach out to anyone on the committee, if you are interested in a position. Reminder: Members of the Nominating committee cannot be slated by the committee, but may be nominated from the floor.

February 7, 2024 Business meeting: Chair of the Nominating committee will announce the slate. Members have an opportunity to consider the slate as presented and to consider potential nominations from the floor which they may like to present at the next business meeting.

March 6, 2024 Business meeting: The President will ask for nominations for each position from the floor and then vote on the nominations.

Note:

There are **26** members, there needs to be a quorum (majority). **13** need to be in attendance to vote.

If there is only one candidate per office, then a motion & a second from the floor are required for secretary to cast the ballot. If more than one candidate, then a separate vote will need to be conducted for each office.
