



Peach Caprese Pasta Salad

Watermelon, Cucumber & Feta Salad w-Mint

Green Salad

Poached Chicken breast slices

Blueberry Crumble

The Peach Caprese Pasta Salad recipe is to the right. A flavor-adding trick that Tim suggested was to cook the corn to just all dente in the water that we later cooked the pasta in.

## Peach Caprese Pasta Salad

Crank up the seasonal vibes with fresh, sweet peaches and a lemony-herb dressing in this sublime take on a side-dish staple.

- 8 oz cavatappi pasta, cooked al dente and drained
- 2 ears com, cooked lightly with kernels cut from cobs
- 4 Roma tomatoes, cut into wedges
- 1/2 cup basil, chopped
- 1/2 red onion, cut into slivers
- 2 peaches, sliced
- 1 cup mini mozzarella balls
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1/2 cup lemon juice
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tsp Dijon mustard
- 1 tsp honey
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1 tsp thyme
- In a large bowl, combine pasta, corn, tomatoes, basil, onion, peaches and mozzarella.
- In a jar with a tightfitting lid, add salt, pepper, lemon juice, garlic, mustard, honey, oil and thyme. Shake until ingredients are fully combined.
- 3. Drizzle desired amount of dressing over pasta and veggies and toss gently to coat. Serves 6 义及

As the Liaison from the Portland, Maine Altrusa club to ASTRA, I want to send you this official "Thank You" for being our ASTRA Advisor for the 2021-2022 LRHS school year. You have done an excellent job with a club that was decimated by 2 years of COVID. Hopefully we are now in the rebuilding stage.

Your efforts are very much appreciated at every level of the Altrusa organization. To give you a little background history: The International organization of Altrusa is 105 years old (organized in 1917); and they developed the ASTRA clubs 50 years later in 1966. The Portland, Maine Altrusa club is 93 years old (organized in 1929) and this is the first ASTRA club we have ever sponsored. It was organized by the LRHS librarian, Katie Klein, who had become a member of the Portland Altrusa club in 2012 when she lived in Westbrook. Towards the end of her first year at LRHS, she approached Portland Altrusa with the thought that she could start an ASTRA club at the high school. We said YES. With the blessings of the Superintendent of SAD 61 schools in the Spring of 2016, the first ASTRA meeting was held in January of 2017; and was chartered with 20 members on February 1, 2017. It is the only ASTRA club in Maine; and currently the only ASTRA club in our District ONE (New England, Eastern Canada, and Bermuda.) Thanks to you, we have just completed our 6<sup>th</sup> year.

I, personally, thank you for leading ASTRA's 2021-2022 year of Community Service activities; and for your commitment to be our on-going Advisor to ASTRA. Considering your home life with two toddlers and the nit-picking details required by Altrusa to run a club and report the results - - I realize it is a humungous commitment. Your efforts are VERY MUCH appreciated by me.

I hope to get you to an Altrusa meeting some day, so that all the members can meet you and thank you personally. I want them to hear your story about why you volunteered to do this. (You told it to ASTRA and me at our first meeting on September 30, 2021.)

We all have you to thank for the 'LRHS ASTRA Club' still existing.

# WE WANT TO KNOW: As a kid were you happy or sad to go back to school in September? And why?




I was always happy since I loved school but also because my mother always made me five new outfits to wear that first week.
