District Three is home to 12 ASTRA clubs of several types: Middle School, High School, College/University and Community.

This exemplifies the flexibility for Altrusa Clubs to sponsor ASTRA Clubs that fit the need of the community. Activities range from fundraising to support projects to enhancing understanding of the world they live in.

MIDDLE SCHOOL ASTRA:

Epiphany ASTRA Club, of Lake City, FL, was able to modify its service activities to comply with COVID-19 protocols and to allow members to participate safely. The Club organized several outside campus Clean Up days. The Club, comprised of middle school students, also planned and hosted an Easter Egg Hunt for the younger students.

UNIVERSITY ASTRA:

The ASTRA Club of Gainesville, FL, Inc., a part of the **University of Florida**, has implemented Field and Fork, a program at the University of Florida (UF) aimed to provide free, nutritious food to members of UF who are in need. The Field and Fork Farm and Gardens is where all of the fresh produce is grown. Whatever is grown in this location is sent to the Food Pantry where members of the UF community who are in need can have easy access to free and nutritious food. Throughout the years, our ASTRA club has volunteered with Field and Fork, both at the Farm and in the Pantry. With the impact that Covid-19 has had on our community, it was especially important for our club to ensure that students at UF were being provided with plenty of fresh food.



Principal and ASTRA Advisor Rita Klenk emphasized the importance of ASTRA this year, "Nothing was normal due to Covid. It was important to have our ASTRA club to provide some extracurricular activities for students as well as some sense of normalcy."



HIGH SCHOOL ASTRA:

ASTRA high school representatives of the **Spartanburg, SC Day School** met with associate professor Dr. Araceli Hernandez-Laroche to discuss women's history, impact, pay equity and the Latinx community.

Community service projects include:

- clothing teddy bears for the Salvation Army,
- creating and delivering Valentine's Day cards to a nursing home,
- participating in teacher appreciation week, and
- walking for the March of Dimes.




SEBASTIAN RIVEST

They are excited to be serving their community! Welcome!






